The book caught and kept my attention from the beginning in the dark alleys of London all the way through to the tearful and emotional final scene. Even though it was written as young adult adventure fiction, this story will touch people of all ages.

God is speaking through *The Adventures of Jonathan Moore* trilogy in so many ways throughout its nineteen chapters. As I was reading the story, Bible verses and concepts kept shouting at me from every page! I pitched my idea of doing a Biblical study guide to Peter and he agreed. This study guide will not ask for chapter outlines, plot points, character development, or word definitions but will provide an opportunity to take a secular story and use Scriptural references, videos, essays, music and thought-provoking questions to teach students how to comprehend a story using a Biblical worldview. *Think Above the Box Study Guides* for books 1 and 2 of the Jonathan Moore series are also available, with additional popular literature guides to come!

The Lord and His teachings are everywhere if one only knows how to find them. May this be the beginning of a whole new way of looking at literature through a Biblical lens!

Send yourself back to the age of tall sailing ships and stow away with Jonathan Moore, Sean Flagon and Miss Delain Dowdeswell on their adventures to the Caribbean, the Black Sea, Africa and all points in between. Based in the early 1800's at the dawn of the Napoleonic Wars, the books are centered on Jonathan Moore and his adventures aboard various sailing ships of the British Royal Navy. Joining Jonathan on these journeys is his best friend and confidant Sean Flagon, their acquaintance made on the mean streets of London. In their travels they meet Delain Dowdeswell, an adventurer in her own right, challenging the order of things as she demands her fair share of excitement and intrigue.

Book 1: **Warship Poseidon** tells the tale of the seemingly-orphaned, twelve-year-old Jonathan Moore, as he is abducted by a gang and pressed into service aboard HMS *Poseidon*, a forty-four gun fighting frigate of the British Royal Navy. However, there is more to the event than just a change of address. How is it that some members of the crew, including the captain, already know his name? Why do the officers seem to favor him above the other new crew members? As Jonathan endeavors to solve these mysteries, he is thrust into a daring mission to recover a hidden treasure on a remote Caribbean isle. Unfortunately, the crew and officers of the *Poseidon* are not the only ones searching for the prize. In a desperate race across the Atlantic, Jonathan is pitted against sword-wielding spies, engages in terrifying ship-to-ship battles, and in the end, must match his wits and courage against a ruthless and cunning French captain and his powerful warship.

Book 2: **Castle of Fire**: Jonathan Moore is now reunited with his father, though soon leaves the comfort of family and London on what is considered by all to be a 'peach' of a mission. However, with the arrival of another midshipman holding a severe but unexplained grudge, life aboard HMS *Danielle* is anything but pleasant. Why are the new midshipmen his enemies? Who is stealing food from the ship's stores, and why must Jonathan and Sean sneak into a heavily guarded Spanish fort in the middle of the night to do some burglary of their own? In this second book of the Adventures of Jonathan Moore Series, Jonathan must capture a stolen British ship from blood-thirsty pirates, solve the mystery of the surprising stowaway, and defend his honor and his life during a fierce duel to the death with a murderous adversary. Alone and vastly outnumbered, the crew of the *Danielle* engages in a violent battle on the wild seas south of the farthest tip of Africa. Only Jonathan, Sean and an unexpected guest can turn the tide of the struggle by unlocking the secrets of a mysterious island and re-igniting the ferocious power of the *Castle of Fire*!

Book 3: **Paladin's War**: 1802. Midshipman Jonathan Moore, Marine Private Sean Flagon and adventurer Delain Dowdeswell enjoy the company of family and friends during a delicate peace between France and England. However, mysterious spy networks now freely roam Europe's great cities, and the ships and armies of all nations remain on the edge of war. An elaborate scheme involves misleading and manipulating Jonathan, now aboard the eighteen-gun HMS *Paladin*, commanded by his friend and mentor, Lieutenant Thomas Harrison. Their mission: to deliver the King's treaty to a clandestine location in the Black Sea. Remaining in London, Delain encounters a shadowy black rider sneaking about the mansions of London's elite. Suspecting foul play, she investigates and enters a web of secret meetings, spies, coded messages and kidnapping. At first merely interesting, Delain's investigation soon turns deadly as she finds that all clues lead to the *Paladin's* mission, and to her friends, now thousands of miles away—and in grave danger. Led to waters far from home, the boys now fight for their ship and their lives against a rogue naval commodore with a war plan of his own. Now in an impossible situation, Jonathan must find a way to defeat his powerful enemies in the Black Sea - and survive the final conflict of the *Paladin's War*.

Guide for Chapter 1

The Lost Echo

1. While considering the hands on HMS *Echo*, Commander Joshua Gray lamented the lack of abilities coming from the ranks of the press gang-procured crew. Depending on how a captain treated them, this form of filling the ranks could prove successful or disastrous! In reading the Bible, you may have noticed that there are quite a few verses that talk about slavery, without necessarily condoning the practice:

1 Timothy 6:1-2 (ERV Easy-to-Read Version) All those who are slaves should show full respect to their masters. Then God's name and our teaching will not be criticized. Some slaves have masters who are believers, so they are brothers. Does this mean they should show their masters any less respect? No, they should serve them even better, because they are helping believers, people they should love. This is what you must teach and tell everyone to do.

Colossians 4:1 (TLB The Living Bible) You slave owners must be just and fair to all your slaves. Always remember that you, too, have a Master in heaven who is closely watching you.

Exodus 21:16 (GW GOD'S WORD Translation) "Whoever kidnaps another person must be put to death, whether he has sold the kidnapped person or still has him."

Ephesians 6:9 (NLT New Living Translation) Masters, treat your slaves in the same way. Don't threaten them; remember, you both have the same Master in heaven, and he has no favorites.

Now, why is that? One would think that God, through His Word, would highly condemn such a system!

2. The *Echo's* original orders were to deliver mail to the British naval station at Gibraltar. The straightforward mission was changed at the last minute to a somewhat clandestine prisoner exchange at a dark, foreboding inlet on the western coast of the island of Dugi Otok. Gray felt most *uneasy* about this new mission and would probably have preferred to keep the uncomplicated original assignment but altered course and followed orders. In the Bible, the prophet Jonah decided to flee from the command that God had given him to go to Nineveh and preach to the Assyrians, a people he detested (for many valid reasons!) *Unlike* Commander Gray, who accepted and followed the new operation, Jonah first disobeyed and fled...

Jonah 1:1-3 (AMP Amplified Bible) Now the word of the Lord came to Jonah the son of Amittai, saying, "Go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim [judgment] against it, for their wickedness has come up before Me." But Jonah ran away to Tarshish to escape from the presence of the Lord [and his duty as His prophet]. He went down to Joppa and found a ship going to Tarshish [the most remote of the Phoenician trading cities]. So he paid the fare and went down into the ship to go with them to Tarshish away from the presence of the Lord.

The following post presents an excellent message on how God wants us to 'follow orders' and go to our 'Nineveh,' whether that is in your school, work, neighborhood, family or team!

Think Above the Box: You know what's coming - describe what you feel your 'Nineveh' is and an experience you had sharing Jesus with someone not exactly open to the good news. How did it go? Did you feel God urging you on? Did you try to board a 'ship to Tarsus' first? Would you do it again? Don't forget that the Holy Spirit is with you!

3. Upon entry into the cliff-enclosed inlet, Captain Gray's cautious instincts led him to slightly alter the original orders and send a jolly boat in to investigate before proceeding with the ship. All the factors leading up to this mission had caused him to be wary and apprehensive. He told Mister Hayes, "*Discretion is the better part of valor.*" The discovery that the prisoner's manacles had been removed was an additional warning sign left unheeded. But even after Spencer's report of the bowl-like, windless cove the captain decided to proceed only after having the crew prepare the bow chaser. All of these factors led to the horrendous attack on the ship resulting in death and destruction for the Royal Navy. The *Echo* had become ensnared by Aggar's diabolical (and successful!) ambush.

► Did the Captain have any subtle warnings about trouble ahead?

► **TAB's take:** Yes, mysterious change in orders, enclosed cove with only one escape route, no wind, prisoner mysteriously unrestrained before order given, unusual mission for a packet, and a questionable crew.

► Why didn't he rely upon his instincts?

► **TAB says:** He was following orders and trusted his superiors, following the Royal Navy chain of command.

Sometimes there are traps laid out for us in life, many we don't see coming, but others that, when we look back, left numerous warning signals and alarms along the way. As stated in the following post, "*Whether you realize it or not, you are walking down a figurative trail in life and Satan has placed many concealed traps in your path in order to take you captive.*" Read about how Satan, like Aggar, can use people as a strategy to entrap us (PS: check out the cool pic!):

These verses from Psalms tell us to rely upon God when we are in danger of becoming ensnared by Satan:

Psalms 25:15 NLT My eyes are always on the Lord, for he rescues me from the traps of my enemies.

Psalms 141:9 (AMPC Amplified Bible, Classic Edition) Keep me from the trap which they have laid for me, and the snares of evildoers.

Psalms 91:3 (ESV English Standard Version) For he will deliver you from the snare of the fowler and from the deadly pestilence.

Psalms 31:4 TLB Pull me from the trap my enemies have set for me. For you alone are strong enough.

Psalms 124:7 ESV We have escaped like a bird from the snare of the fowlers; the snare is broken, and we have escaped!



Think Above the Box: Think of a time when you entered a seemingly benign situation that ended up being your very own personal gnarly-pined cove with almost no escape. What were some warning signs that you either ignored or didn't perceive? Has the experience made you more cognizant of Satan's traps?

REAL LIFE: Dana Goodrum's life with an abusive father, several disastrous relationships, and the abortion of her third child had left her in a deep *cove* of rejection and regrets. She tells how Jesus became the wind that got her out from the foggy, rock bottom, inescapable inlet that her life had become:

APOLO-GET-ITS: After all this Jonah talk, let's get some facts on the question: Was Jonah really swallowed by a big fish? First, an overview:

Matthew 12:38-41 ESV Then some of the scribes and Pharisees answered him, saying, "Teacher, we wish to see a sign from you." But he answered them, "An evil and adulterous generation seeks for a sign, but no sign will be given to it except the sign of the prophet Jonah. For just as Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of the great fish, so will the Son of Man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth. The men of Nineveh will rise up at the judgment with this generation and condemn it, for they repented at the preaching of Jonah, and behold, something greater than Jonah is here."

1. After experiencing all of the excitement, frenzy and thrills of being a stowaway and firing cannons at Napoleon's forces from a castle turret, the life of a proper young lady getting schooled in the prim decorum and deportment of London society was downright dull and excruciatingly boring to Delain Dowdeswell, *Adventurer*. In life, we all experience ups and downs, good and bad, scary and safe, don't we?

Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 NLT For everything there is a season, a time for every activity under heaven. A time to be born and a time to die. A time to plant and a time to harvest. A time to kill and a time to heal. A time to tear down and a time to build up. A time to cry and a time to laugh. A time to grieve and a time to dance. A time to scatter stones and a time to gather stones. A time to embrace and a time to turn away. A time to search and a time to quit searching. A time to keep and a time to throw away. A time to tear and a time to mend. A time to be quiet and a time to speak. A time to love and a time to hate. A time for war and a time for peace.

Philippians 4:12 NLT I know how to live on almost nothing or with everything. I have learned the secret of living in every situation, whether it is with a full stomach or empty, with plenty or little.

Think Above the Box: Do you feel as Delain does, that there are seasons of good stuff and then seasons of bad (or boring?) Name a time when you went for a 'roller coaster ride' in your life. Do you think we learn and grow more from the ups or the downs? Did you feel God walking alongside you? How would you know? What did you learn about yourself (and others?)

2. While lamenting the dullness of her city life, Delain remarked that one thing that stimulates her imagination is 'people-watching.' With her gifts of observation, insight, acuity and perceptiveness, a simple glance at a person told her many things, such as when she noted a seemingly unremarkable man in the street. His out of season costly coat, slack grooming habits, muddy shoes and gold pocket watch did not seem to add up. The ability to *discern* people and events is a very beneficial quality to have. God thinks so too!

Romans 12:2 ERV Don't change yourselves to be like the people of this world, but let God change you inside with a new way of thinking. Then you will be able to understand and accept what God wants for you. You will be able to know what is good and pleasing to him and what is perfect.

Hebrews 5:14 AMPC But solid food is for full-grown men, for those whose senses *and* mental faculties are trained by practice to discriminate *and* distinguish between what is morally good *and* noble and what is evil *and* contrary either to divine or human law.

Hebrews 4:12 ESV For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and **discerning** the thoughts and intentions of the heart.

You may have heard a statement similar to this, "*When you believe in nothing, you'll fall for anything.*"

This rings true, especially for believers. Biblical discernment is a skill all Christians should possess!

1 Kings 3:9 ESV Give your servant therefore an understanding mind to govern your people, that I may **discern** between good and evil, for who is able to govern this your great people?

Acts 17:11 ERV The people in Berea were more open-minded than those in Thessalonica. They were so glad to hear the message Paul told them. They studied the Scriptures every day to make sure that what they heard was really true.

When involved in a conversation about God and what people believe, Christians should be able to *discern* if the arguments that are presented are valid in regards to the truth of Jesus and the Gospel.

1 John 4:1-6 TLB Dearly loved friends, don't always believe everything you hear just because someone says it is a message from God: test it first to see if it really is. For there are many false teachers around, and the way to find out if their message is from the Holy Spirit is to ask: Does it really agree that Jesus Christ, God's Son, actually became man with a human body? If so, then the message is from God. If not, the message is not from God but from one who is against Christ, like the "Antichrist" you have heard about who is going to come, and his attitude of enmity against Christ is already abroad in the world. Dear young friends, you belong to God and have already won your fight with those who are against Christ because there is someone in your hearts who is stronger than any evil teacher in this wicked world. These men belong to this world, so, quite naturally, they are concerned about worldly affairs and the world pays attention to them. But we are children of God; that is why only those who have walked and talked with God will listen to us. Others won't. That is another way to know whether a message is really from God; for if it is, the world won't listen to it.

3. Delain was right to question the strange bearing of the bearded man, Orvislat, as he took a serpentine route from the ice cream shop to Queen Anne's Gate, confident that he had not been detected or pursued. Have you ever observed an ant scurrying about the grass, blissfully unaware of your foot and its own demise just inches away? Or how about the *ubiquitous* presence of cameras everywhere you look from home security systems to our cell phones and computers? Ever get the feeling that you are being watched wherever you go? Well, you are! Camera lenses can be covered, but Scripture tells us that God has had His eye on us from before we were born!

Psalms 139:15-16 AMP My frame was not hidden from You, when I was being formed in secret, and intricately and skillfully formed [as if embroidered with many colors] in the depths of the earth. Your eyes have seen my unformed substance; and in Your book were all written the days that were appointed *for me*, when as yet there was not one of them [even taking shape].

Hebrews 4:13 TLB He knows about everyone, everywhere. Everything about us is bare and wide open to the all-seeing eyes of our living God; nothing can be hidden from him to whom we must explain all that we have done.

Jeremiah 23:24 AMP "Can anyone hide himself in secret places so that I cannot see him?" says the Lord. "Do I not fill heaven and earth?" says the Lord.

REAL LIFE: As discussed in question 3 above, there is no escape from God, but that is a **good** thing!

Deuteronomy 31:6 GW Be strong and courageous. Don't tremble! Don't be afraid of them! The Lord your God is the one who is going with you. He won't abandon you or leave you.

[Golgotha is another name for Calvary, the hill that Jesus was crucified on.] Now the fascinating thing is that these are verses from **Isaiah 53:3, 5, 9, 11 NLT** which were written about 700 years **before** Jesus' arrival on Earth! Many people through the ages have come to Christ after learning about this ancient prophecy that could only have been fulfilled by Him.

Guide for Chapter 3

Paladin's Race

1. Young Sean was undergoing Royal Marine training under the skilled eyes of Corporal Hudson, with the added assistance of Private Hicks. In the course of preparing for target practice with a heavy musket meant for a larger man, not a mere boy, Sean asked if he really needs this big weapon when he is already masterfully skilled at swordplay. It would have been so much easier on him to count on his sword rather than struggle with musket practice. Hudson admonished him and stated that it was the Marines' duty to keep the enemy *off* the ships, which was best accomplished by muskets, and that swords are for when the enemy had actually *boarded* the ship and were a last resort. The preference for sword versus musket could be a picture of a person using earthly, human based values when making choices in their life as opposed to using God's direction as written in His Word. They may be quite adept at the ways of the world and elect the easiest route, resulting in what most people call 'success.'

Genesis 13:10-13 ESV And Lot lifted up his eyes and saw that the Jordan Valley was well watered everywhere like the garden of the Lord, like the land of Egypt, in the direction of Zoar. (This was before the Lord destroyed Sodom and Gomorrah.) So Lot chose for himself all the Jordan Valley, and Lot journeyed east. Thus they separated from each other. Abram settled in the land of Canaan, while Lot settled among the cities of the valley and moved his tent as far as Sodom. Now the men of Sodom were wicked, great sinners against the Lord.

Mark 8:36 TLB And how does a man benefit if he gains the whole world and loses his soul in the process?

This famous quote has undergone a slight metamorphosis through the years. An abridged version refers to a 'God-shaped vacuum' in our hearts which paints an accurate picture of the sentiment, as people search in vain to fill their hearts with worldly things but still find themselves unfulfilled, incomplete, miserable, discontented and unsatisfied.

Ecclesiastes 3:11 AMPC He has made everything beautiful in its time. He also has planted eternity in men's hearts and minds [a divinely implanted sense of a purpose working through the ages which nothing under the sun but God alone can satisfy], yet so that men cannot find out what God has done from the beginning to the end.

C.S. Lewis in his book *Mere Christianity* stated, "If I find in myself a desire which no experience in this world can satisfy, the most probable explanation is that I was made for another world." The following essay addresses this:

And this patience is proof that we are strong. And this proof gives us hope. And this hope will never disappoint us. We know this because God has poured out his love to fill our hearts through the Holy Spirit he gave us.

Romans 8:28 AMPC We are assured *and* know that [God being a partner in their labor] all things work together *and* are [fitting into a plan] for good to *and* for those who love God and are called according to [His] design *and* purpose.

1. The ever-perceptive Delain reignited her detection skills once more in regards to Lord and Lady Wilder. Other verses in Scripture corroborate this:

1 John 4:1 GW Dear friends, don't believe all people who say that they have the Spirit. Instead, test them. See whether the spirit they have is from God, because there are many false prophets in the world.

2 Timothy 3:15 TLB You know how, when you were a small child, you were taught the holy Scriptures; and it is these that make you wise to accept God's salvation by trusting in Christ Jesus.

Titus 1:9 AMP He must hold fast to the sure *and* trustworthy Word of God as he was taught it, so that he may be able both to give stimulating instruction *and* encouragement in sound (wholesome) doctrine and to refute *and* convict those who contradict *and* oppose it [showing the wayward their error].

2 Timothy 4:3 ERV The time will come when people will not listen to the true teaching. But people will find more and more teachers who please them. They will find teachers who say what they want to hear.

It's too bad that he wasn't a Berean! As Scripture tells us, sin likes darkness too:

John 3:19-20 ESV And this is the judgment: the light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his works should be exposed.

Proverbs 2:13-14 NLT These men turn from the right way to walk down dark paths. They take pleasure in doing wrong, and they enjoy the twisted ways of evil.

John 11:10 MSG Jesus replied, "Are there not twelve hours of daylight? Anyone who walks in daylight doesn't stumble because there's plenty of light from the sun. Walking at night, he might very well stumble because he can't see where he's going."

2 Corinthians 6:14 GW Stop forming inappropriate relationships with unbelievers. Can right and wrong be partners? Can light have anything in common with darkness?

John 1:4-5 ERV In him there was life, and that life was a light for the people of the world. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not defeated it.

1. Commander Gray and his small crew found themselves marooned on the island of Dugi Otok, on the shore of a most inhospitable cove with few natural resources. Sailors were dying daily due to lack of food, fuel and medical supplies. The men had to rely on their ingenuity to stay alive, including fashioning a crude fishing hook from Gray's pin and Ike William's fishing line. The clothing of the dead was kept for warmth, one man's sole job was keeping flies off their meager food supply and what little brush was procured was gathered for the nightly fire that lasted only an hour. We can define *resourcefulness* as the ability to handle a crisis or situation with talent, competence and imagination. Under these bleak conditions, it would have been very easy to succumb to depression and hopelessness, as Gray stated, *"There is no way out, except as angels."* Fortunately, the Captain and his men refused to give up or surrender. God wishes us to also never lose hope:

Psalm 46:1-3 NLT God is our refuge and strength, always ready to help in times of trouble. So we will not fear when earthquakes come and the mountains crumble into the sea. Let the oceans roar and foam. Let the mountains tremble as the waters surge!

Romans 12:12 AMP ...*constantly* rejoicing in hope [because of our confidence in Christ], steadfast *and* patient in distress, devoted to prayer [continually seeking wisdom, guidance, and strength].

Romans 15:4 GNT Everything written in the Scriptures was written to teach us, in order that we might have hope through the patience and encouragement which the Scriptures give us.

Matthew 24:13 ESV But the one who endures to the end will be saved.

Even though Gray stated that he was no longer Captain, his actions and care for his men showed that he was still a true leader in his heart. In life, we may be called by many monikers, such as Boss, Coach, rockstar, champion, millionaire, Doctor,

Principal and General. But once deprived of all such honors, what are we left with? No matter who *we* think we are, God knows our true self and heart:

Acts 10:34 ERV Peter began to speak: "I really understand now that God does not consider some people to be better than others."

Luke 16:15 NLT Then he said to them, "You like to appear righteous in public, but God knows your hearts. What this world honors is detestable in the sight of God."

Acts 15:8 TLB God, who knows men's hearts, confirmed the fact that he accepts Gentiles by giving them the Holy Spirit, just as he gave him to us.

Jeremiah 17:10 GW I, the Lord, search minds and test hearts. I will reward each person for what he has done. I will reward him for the results of his actions.

1 Samuel 16:7 ESV But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him. For the Lord sees not as man sees: man looks on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart."

A Change of Orders

1. The promotional titles that the lead officer of the *Paladin* held were the subject of much consternation for Miss Barbara Thompson as Admiral Moore attempted to explain the “*strange lexicon*” to her. Was Harrison a Lieutenant, Captain, Master or Commander? Or all of them? Such are the military rankings of the British Royal Navy which are rewarded to an individual based on their performance and achievement. The Bible tells us that believers will also be “ranked” in Heaven in the form of rewards (crowns) bestowed upon them by Jesus.

Matthew 16:27 AMPC For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory (majesty, splendor) of His Father with His angels, and then He will render account *and* reward every man in accordance with what he has done.

Matthew 25:21 NLT “The master was full of praise. ‘Well done, my good and faithful servant. You have been faithful in handling this small amount, so now I will give you many more responsibilities. Let’s celebrate together!’”

2 Timothy 4:8 AMPC [As to what remains] henceforth there is laid up for me the [victor’s] crown of righteousness [for being right with God and doing right], which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me *and* recompense me on that [great] day—and not to me only, but also to all those who have loved *and* yearned for *and* welcomed His appearing (His return).

Does this mean we have to *work* for our admittance into Heaven? NO! Just as Harrison was a standing member of the British Royal Navy, all believers will be standing members of Heaven, regardless of ‘rank.’

Ephesians 2:8-9 AMPC For it is by free grace (God’s unmerited favor) that you are saved (delivered from judgment *and* made partakers of Christ’s salvation) through [your] faith. And this [salvation] is not of yourselves [of your own doing, it came not through your own striving], but it is the gift of God; Not because of works [not the fulfillment of the Law’s demands], lest any man should boast. [It is not the result of what anyone can possibly do, so no one can pride himself in it or take

glory to himself.]

1 Timothy 6:18-19 TLB Tell them to use their money to do good. They should be rich in good works and should give happily to those in need, always being ready to share with others whatever God has given them. By doing this they will be storing up real treasure for themselves in heaven—it is the only safe investment for eternity! And they will be living a fruitful Christian life down here as well.

Luke 23:40-43 TLB But the other criminal protested. “Don’t you even fear God when you are dying? We deserve to die for our evil deeds, but this man hasn’t done one thing wrong.” Then he said, “Jesus, remember me when you come into your Kingdom.” And Jesus replied, “Today you will be with me in Paradise. This is a solemn promise.”

2. Nathaniel Moore, in bidding goodbye to his son Jonathan and Sean, warned them to be careful on their voyage, cautioning that *“Just because there is a peace [no war with France,] the sea is still a dangerous place.”* A calm ocean can swiftly change into a raging squall. Could this admonition also apply to the life of a Christian in that we are saved and no longer at odds with our Maker, but we still must live here on a fallen planet?

John 16:33 AMPC I have told you these things, so that in Me you may have [perfect] peace *and* confidence. In the world you have tribulation *and* trials *and* distress *and* frustration; but be of good cheer [take courage; be confident, certain, undaunted]! For I have overcome the world. [I have deprived it of power to harm you and have conquered it for you.]

1 Timothy 4:7 AMPC But refuse *and* avoid irreverent legends (profane and impure and godless fictions, mere grandmothers' tales) and silly myths, *and* express your disapproval of them. Train yourself toward godliness (piety), [keeping yourself spiritually fit].

Colossians 2:8 ESV See to it that no one takes you captive by philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the world, and not according to Christ.

Isaiah 8:19 NLT Someone may say to you, "Let's ask the mediums and those who consult the spirits of the dead. With their whisperings and mutterings, they will tell us what to do." But shouldn't people ask God for guidance? Should the living seek guidance from the dead?

Two Plots

1. Cloak and dagger types often communicate by code so that their plans are not discovered, which explains the rather nonsensical discourse at O'Sullivan's Cock and Bull between the three men sitting in a shadowy corner of the pub. A passerby might surmise that they were discussing the weather when in actuality they were trading valuable intelligence. Many non-believers look at Scripture the same way - that it is too complicated to understand, doesn't make sense and can't be taken literally as truth. A believer can address this by knowing that the Bible makes use of the tools of phenomenological language, hyperbole, metaphors, anthropomorphisms, personification and symbolism. Oh my! Are your eyes crossing yet? It's time to uncross them! The following link will show how, *"The fact that figures of speech and other literary devices are used in Scripture in no way takes away from its nonfiction message."*

Should the Bible be interpreted literally? (compellingtruth.org)

Just for fun, here are some illustrations:

Phenomenological language **Psalm 93:1** NLT The world stands firm and cannot be shaken.

Hyperbole **Matthew 7:3** ESV Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye?

Simile/Metaphor **Proverbs 13:14** ESV The teaching of the wise is a fountain of life, that one may turn away from the snares of death.

Anthropomorphism **Isaiah 23:11** GW The Lord has stretched his hand over the sea to shake kingdoms.

Personification **Luke 19:40** AMPC He replied, I tell you that if these keep silent, the very stones will cry out.

Symbolism **Hebrews 11:12** GW Abraham was as good as dead. Yet, from this man came descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the grains of sand on the seashore.

2. Gorman and his two cohorts, Frey and Fairchild, frequented the clandestine, tawdry underbelly of London as spies for the king. They stalked and sometimes captured various *ne'er-do-wells*, criminals and pariahs for the greater good of Britain. Jesus also hung with thieves, criminals, prostitutes, the sick and the dying to further His kingdom. Now why would the Son of God hang with the lowest people instead of the very learned and accomplished scribes, Pharisees, Sadducees and religious scholars of the time?

Matthew 9:10-13 ERV Jesus ate dinner at Matthew's house. Many tax collectors and others with bad reputations came and ate with him and his followers. The Pharisees saw that Jesus was eating with these people. They asked his followers, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and other sinners?" Jesus heard them say this. So he said to them, "It is the sick people who need a doctor, not those who are healthy. You need to go and

learn what this Scripture means: 'I don't want animal sacrifices; I want you to show kindness to people.' I did not come to invite good people. I came to invite sinners."

Matthew 23:25-28 NLT "What sorrow awaits you teachers of religious law and you Pharisees. Hypocrites! For you are so careful to clean the outside of the cup and the dish, but inside you are filthy—full of greed and self-indulgence! You blind Pharisee! First wash the inside of the cup and the dish, and then the outside will become clean, too. What sorrow awaits you teachers of religious law and you Pharisees. Hypocrites! For you are like whitewashed tombs—beautiful on the outside but filled on the inside with dead people's bones and all sorts of impurity. Outwardly you look like righteous people, but inwardly your hearts are filled with hypocrisy and lawlessness."

2. Harrison called a meeting with his officers to discuss the *Paladin's* new orders and included Lieutenant Quinn and Midshipman Moore for their input. Romans 2:15 AMPC They show that the essential requirements of the Law are written in their hearts *and* are operating there, with which their consciences (sense of right and wrong) also bear witness; and their [moral] decisions (their arguments of reason, their condemning or approving thoughts) will accuse or perhaps defend *and* excuse [them].

1 Timothy 1:19 NLT Cling to your faith in Christ, and keep your conscience clear. For some people have deliberately violated their consciences; as a result, their faith has been shipwrecked.

It can set your whole life on fire, for it is set on fire by hell itself.

Black Riders and Tea

1. Trying to beat the rain, Barbara and Delain hastily dashed towards the horse carriage waiting in the driveway, oblivious to the fact that Steward must sit atop it unprotected from the storm. After ushering them safely into the covered vehicle before an impending downpour, the old man sardonically remarked, “*Yet fer some, it’s our lot in life. Serving others. Gettin’ wet. Bein’ ignored.*” British society at the time dictated a strict division of the classes so it probably wouldn’t have occurred to the two ladies to even consider Steward’s cold, wet reality. As Christians, we are to always be cognizant of others in need. Jesus spoke of this also:

Proverbs 28:27 AMP He who gives to the poor will never want, but he who shuts his eyes [from their need] will have many curses.

Deuteronomy 15:10-11 AMP You shall freely *and* generously give to him, and your heart shall not be resentful when you give to him, because for this [generous] thing the Lord your God will bless you in all your work and in all your undertakings. For the poor will never cease to be in the land; therefore I command you, saying, ‘You shall freely open your hand to your brother, to your needy, and to your poor in your land.’

1 John 3:17 ERV Suppose a believer who is rich enough to have all the necessities of life sees a fellow believer who is poor and does not have even basic needs. What if the rich believer does not help the poor one? Then it is clear that God’s love is not in that person’s heart.

Deuteronomy 15:7-8 GW This is what you must do whenever there are poor Israelites in one of your cities in the land that the Lord your God is giving you. Be generous to these poor people, and freely lend them as much as they need. Never be hard-hearted and tight-fisted with them.

James 2:1-8 AMP My fellow believers, do not practice your faith in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ with *an attitude of partiality* [toward people—show no favoritism, no prejudice, no snobbery]. For if a man comes into your meeting place wearing a gold ring and fine clothes, and a poor man in dirty clothes also comes in, and you pay special attention to the one who wears the fine clothes, and say to him, “You sit here in this good seat,” and you tell the poor man, “You stand over there, or sit down [on the floor] by my footstool,” have you not discriminated among yourselves, and become judges with wrong motives? Listen, my beloved brothers and sisters: has not God chosen the poor of this world to be rich in faith and [as believers to be] heirs of the kingdom which He promised to those who love Him? But you [in contrast] have dishonored the poor man. Is it not the rich who oppress *and* exploit you, and personally drag you into the courts of law? Do they not blaspheme the precious name [of Christ] by which you are called? If, however, you are [really] fulfilling the royal law according to the Scripture, “You shall love your neighbor as yourself [that is, if you have an unselfish concern for others and do things for their benefit]” you are doing well.

Favoritism means giving preferential treatment and being partial and biased to a person or persons over others. Read the following link to learn what God has to say about *prosôpolepsía* (that’s Greek for *partiality*.)

Think Above the Box: What do you think these ladies could have done for Steward, being that in order to drive them to the tea, he *had* to sit out in the open and tradition and decorum pretty much allowed them to ignore the fact that he was an older man out in the rain? Just as it was automatic for them to not even consider him, as Christians we should develop an automatic heart for love, care and service to all regardless of who they are.

2. Delain's curiosity and unrelenting quest for adventure found her at the rear of the Wilder's mansion, breathlessly hanging on to an outside ledge for dear life as the mysterious rider inside looked right at her face through the distortion of the angel clad stained glass window. To her relief, he didn't even see her as he gazed out to find the source of the sounds made by the gardener. For Delain, her glass 'guardian angels' protected her from harm.

Psalm 91:9-13 TLB For Jehovah is my refuge! I choose the God above all gods to shelter me. How then can evil overtake me or any plague come near? For he orders his angels to protect you wherever you go. They will steady you with their hands to keep you from stumbling against the rocks on the trail. You can safely meet a lion or step on poisonous snakes, yes, even trample them beneath your feet!

There is an event in the Old Testament where a somewhat similar event happened in regards to someone not seeing what was right in front of them, 'the unseen spiritual world' complete with chariots of fire!

2 Kings 6:15-17 ESV When the servant of the man of God rose early in the morning and went out, behold, an army with horses and chariots was all around the city. And the servant said, "Alas, my master! What shall we do?" He said, "Do not be afraid, for those who are with us are more than those who are with them." Then Elisha prayed and said, "O Lord, please open his eyes that he may see." So the Lord opened the eyes of the young man, and he saw, and behold, the mountain was full of horses and chariots of fire all around Elisha.

The Echo Returns

1. After being scolded by Jonathan for his equatorial souvenir of a gold earring, Sean was astonished to learn that he was going to be a marine officer one day, which was an intriguing thought and a distinguished accomplishment, but the road ahead would be full of *"some amount of responsibility that would certainly require substantial effort."* This had the inexperienced marine questioning his talents and abilities to earn the position. Long ago, another young man needed encouragement to complete his task also. In his letter written to Timothy, the apostle Paul encourages him to stay strong in the face of persecution and the evil of the world, using the metaphors of soldier, athlete and farmer. Like Timothy, Sean would need to be singularly focused:

2 Timothy 2:3-7 NLT Endure suffering along with me, as a good soldier of Christ Jesus. Soldiers don't get tied up in the affairs of civilian life, for then they cannot please the officer who enlisted them. And athletes cannot win the prize unless they follow the rules. And hardworking farmers should be the first to enjoy the fruit of their labor. Think about what I am saying. The Lord will help you understand all these things.

2 Timothy 4:7 NLT I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, and I have remained faithful.

Psalms 18:39 NLT You have armed me with strength for the battle; you have subdued my enemies under my feet.

Matthew 25:23 AMPC His master said to him, Well done, you upright (honorable, admirable) and faithful servant! You have been faithful *and* trustworthy over a little; I will put you in charge of much. Enter into *and* share the joy (the delight, the blessedness) which your master enjoys.

2 Corinthians 5:9 TLB So our aim is to please him always in everything we do, whether we are here in this body or away from this body and with him in heaven.

The resulting reinforcement looked as if the mast was covered in a giant cage. Our hearts can be like that cracked mast. If we choose to live without God and allow sin to be ever-present, we can cover up all resultant hurt and damage with the 'lumber' of avoidance, lies, alcohol, drugs, bad relationships, worldliness, etc. If our 'cage' gets too thick, we can become 'hard-hearted' and the Holy Spirit cannot get through. But all is not lost! Jesus can replace your damaged, caged mast with a new, strong one:

Proverbs 28:14 GW Blessed is the one who is always fearful of sin, but whoever is hard-hearted falls into disaster.

Romans 2:5 ESV But because of your hard and impenitent heart you are storing up wrath for yourself on the day of wrath when God's righteous judgment will be revealed.

Ephesians 4:18 NLT Their minds are full of darkness; they wander far from the life God gives because they have closed their minds and hardened their hearts against him.

As stated in the following link, just like encasing a damaged mast with a wooden cage, the

When he speaks a falsehood, he speaks what is natural to him, for he is a liar [himself] and the father of lies *and* of all that is false.

Acts 13:7-10 AMPC He was closely associated with the proconsul, Sergius Paulus, who was an intelligent *and* sensible man of sound understanding; he summoned to him Barnabas and Saul and sought to hear the Word of God [concerning salvation in the kingdom of God attained through Christ]. But Elymas the wise man—for that is the translation of his name [which he had given himself]—opposed them, seeking to keep the proconsul from accepting the faith. But Saul, who is also called Paul, filled with *and* controlled by the Holy Spirit, looked steadily at [Elymas] and said, You master in every form of deception *and* recklessness, unscrupulousness, *and* wickedness, you son of the devil, you enemy of everything that is upright *and* good, will you never stop perverting *and* making crooked the straight paths of the Lord *and* plotting against His saving purposes?

Matthew 13:38 TLB The field is the world, and the seed represents the people of the Kingdom; the thistles are the people belonging to Satan.

Guide for Chapter 13

The Cove at Telaščica

1. As the *Paladin* slowly and cautiously entered the small bay of the fishing village of Telaščica, Hudson, Hicks and Sean found themselves at the stern of the ship, tasked with looking for any trouble approaching from behind. They discussed the orders for the ship to back into the bay, and Hicks opined that the plan was harebrained. Sean replies that he and Jonathan had a rule during their residency in the alleys of London, “*never get in an alley that has no back door.*” Sounds like good advice! But what do you do when circumstances, events or choices put you there? Is all lost?

Exodus 14:13 GW Moses answered the people, “Don’t be afraid! Stand still, and see what the Lord will do to save you today. You will never see these Egyptians again.

Philippians 4:6-7 GW Never worry about anything. But in every situation let God know what you need in prayers and requests while giving thanks. Then God’s peace, which goes beyond anything we can imagine, will guard your thoughts and emotions through Christ Jesus.

Psalms 34:4-7 AMPC I sought (inquired of) the Lord *and* required Him [of necessity and on the authority of His Word], and He heard me, and delivered me from all my fears. They looked to Him and were radiant; their faces shall never blush for shame *or* be confused. This poor man cried, and the Lord heard him, and saved him out of all his troubles. The Angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear Him [who revere and worship Him with awe] and each of them He delivers.

2. Quinn, assigned to the crow’s nest to watch for approaching ships, told Sean that he had seen only whitecaps. When advised that the men thought they had seen a sail, he sternly stated that there was “*nothing to be seen.*” He then proceeded to scan the shoreline instead of the sea as ordered, raising the suspicions of Sean, Hicks and

Hudson. Even though he was the lower rank of marine sergeant and Quinn was a full lieutenant, the suspicious reaction and angry tone had Hudson heading to Captain Harrison to report the incident. This breach of military protocol would likely result in him *"getting the short stick"* but he did it anyway because it was the *right* thing to do.

Proverbs 11:19-21 ERV People who do what is right are on their way to life, but those who always want to do wrong are on their way to death. The Lord hates those who love to do evil, but he is pleased with those who try to do right. The truth is, evil people will be punished, and good people will be set free.

The word *integrity* can be defined as one who has strong morals, good character, virtue, honesty and honor. One could certainly say that Hudson put doing what was right ahead of any negative career consequences he might suffer as a result. God counsels us to always strive to do the right thing:

Galatians 6:9 TLB And let us not get tired of doing what is right, for after a while we will reap a harvest of blessing if we don't get discouraged and give up.

Deuteronomy 6:18 ESV And you shall do what is right and good in the sight of the Lord, that it may go well with you, and that you may go in and take possession of the good land that the Lord swore to give to your fathers

2 Thessalonians 3:13 GW Brothers and sisters, we can't allow ourselves to get tired of doing what is right.

In today's culture, integrity is in very short supply. Let's investigate the Biblical teachings on this courageous character quality. The post below states *"In the Old Testament, the Hebrew word translated 'integrity' means 'the condition of being without blemish, completeness, perfection, sincerity, soundness, uprightness, wholeness.' Integrity in the New Testament means 'honesty and adherence to a pattern of good works.'"*

3. *"I'd be a fool to go in there,"* stated the captain as he ordered the *Paladin* to reverse course and head back towards Telašćica. Jonathan, with his covert intelligence from Spears and Wilder at the forefront of his mind, challenged Harrison's decision, even going as far as not addressing him properly as *Captain*. His strenuous opposition to orders lead to an angry admonishment from his friend to never question him again. In our lives, there are times when we feel the need to question *our* Captain, God Himself. Sometimes because bad and evil things are happening and sometimes to gain understanding of what God wants from us. Is it wrong to do this? Will God react like Harrison or like a loving Father?

Psalms 10:1 Why, O LORD, do you stand far away? Why do you hide yourself in times of trouble?

Romans 9:20-24 GW Who do you think you are to talk back to God like that? Can an object that was made say to its maker, "Why did you make me like this?" A potter has the right to do whatever he wants with his clay. He can make something for a special occasion or something for everyday use from the same lump of clay. If God wants to demonstrate his anger and reveal his power, he can do it. But can't he be extremely patient with people who are objects of his anger because they are headed for destruction? Can't God also reveal the riches of his glory to people who are objects of his mercy and who he had already prepared for glory? This is what God did for us whom he called—whether we are Jews or not.

1 John 5:14 AMPC And this is the confidence (the assurance, the privilege of boldness) which we have in Him: [we are sure] that if we ask anything (make any request) according to His will (in agreement with His own plan), He listens to *and* hears us.

4. After the event of Quinn's peculiar behavior regarding neglecting his duty, the captain pondered why he was acting so odd. He thought about other crewmen he had known, including even Steward, who would have been considered weird, quirky, eccentric and different, concluding that all Quinn needed was "*a little seasoning.*" Harrison's assessment of Quinn resulted in him giving the young man a second chance. One could suppose that the outcome of this choice was really in the hands of Quinn himself. As the captain and all of us know, in life we will run across all types of characters, including ourselves, who are good, bad, happy, sad, strange, wonderful, etc. Aren't all people on a journey heading to or away from God? What does God want us to do with them?

Ephesians 2:1-3 TLB Once you were under God's curse, doomed forever for your sins. You went along with the crowd and were just like all the others, full of sin, obeying Satan, the mighty prince of the power of the air, who is at work right now in the hearts of those who are against the Lord. All of us used to be just as they are, our lives expressing the evil within us, doing every wicked thing that our passions or our evil thoughts might lead us into. We started out bad, being born with evil natures, and were under God's anger just like everyone else.

Romans 15:7 NLT Therefore, accept each other just as Christ has accepted you so that God will be given glory.

Two Letters

1. The Dowdeswell sisters were in a state of euphoria upon the receipt of the three letters from Harrison, Jonathan and Sean, that had taken a circuitous journey starting from the confines of the *Paladin*, through Gibraltar, the Canary Islands, Chatham, the Admiralty and finally to the Bracknell estate. Correspondence between parties often took weeks, months, and even years depending on how far the writer was from the recipient. No texts, Instagram, Facebook, Twitter, TikTok or email! Oh, the *horror*! How did they ever survive?!?

Did you know that many books of the Bible are actually composed in the form of letters which were passed from the original recipients on to other locations, groups and churches? There are 21 *epistles* in the New Testament with the most prolific letter-writer being Paul, who penned a total of 13 epistles (14 if you count the unsigned book of Hebrews.) Whereas Delain wanted the sisters to keep their letters to themselves, these Biblical dispatches were circulated far and wide.

2 Thessalonians 2:15 GW Then, brothers and sisters, firmly hold on to the traditions we taught you either when we spoke to you or in our letter.

Colossians 4:16 ESV And when this letter has been read among you, have it also read in the church of the Laodiceans; and see that you also read the letter from Laodicea.

1 Thessalonians 5:27 ERV I tell you by the authority of the Lord to read this letter to all the believers there.

Proverbs 25:2 GW It is the glory of God to hide things but the glory of kings to investigate them.

1. This chapter opens with a mini-tutorial on the various methods of stealing a ship: engaging a 'chase'—a ship at sea—and winning a battle, forcing a surrender of an unarmed or lesser-powered ship, or using an overpowering force of men to sneak up on a moored ship to attack and take it—called 'cutting out.' Like the Russian leader Nikomed Aggar, our culture today uses different means to convince young (and old) Christians to doubt their faith and join the ranks of unbelievers. The techniques applied include subtle anti-Christian references and mocking remarks in movies, television shows, newscasts and literature to outright hatred and discrimination (think anti-creationism in science classes and revisionist history.)

Psalm 1:1 ESV Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners.

Jeremiah 5:26-28 ERV There are evil men among my people. They are like men who make nets for catching birds. They set their traps, but they catch people instead of birds. Their houses are full of lies, like a cage full of birds. Their lies made them rich and powerful from the evil they have done. There is no end to the evil they do. They will not plead the case of children who have no parents. They will not help these orphans. They will not let the poor be judged fairly.

2. After observing and counting the *Paladin* crews' whereabouts and noting that her officers were departing, Aggar decided to implement his plan of attacking the moored ship. 3. While below deck, Jonathan had a cryptic conversation with Jenkins that told him that the old sailor was well aware of his meeting with Wilder and Spears on the docks at Wapping, his dishonesty towards Captain Harrison and the other officers, and his presenting of peculiar strategies in meetings. His tale of being deceitful and stealing a bottle of wine for a lieutenant, resulting in Jenkin's naval advancement being derailed, was lovingly given to the young man as an object lesson. Fortunately, Jonathan figures this out and resolves to clear the air and confess his mysterious "assignment" with the captain. One could assume that Jenkins understood that the two men from the Admiralty used Jonathan as a pawn, putting him somewhat between a rock and a hard place. The older man had found a gentle, non-accusatory way to get across to the midshipman what he needed to do to make things right.

Proverbs 27:6 AMP Faithful are the wounds of a friend [who corrects out of love and concern], But the kisses of an enemy are deceitful [because they serve his hidden agenda].

Ephesians 4:29 ERV When you talk, don't say anything bad. But say the good things that people need—whatever will help them grow stronger. Then what you say will be a blessing to those who hear you.

Just as Jenkins was kindly prodding Jonathan to see that he had to come clean to Harrison, the Apostle Paul

wrote this to the Corinthians:

2 Corinthians 7:9-10 TLB Now I am glad I sent it, not because it hurt you but because the pain turned you to God. It was a good kind of sorrow you felt, the kind of sorrow God wants his people to have, so that I need not come to you with harshness. For God sometimes uses sorrow in our lives to help us turn away from sin and seek eternal life. We should never regret his sending it. But the sorrow of the man who is not a Christian is not the sorrow of true repentance and does not prevent eternal death.

Secrets seem to be a part of life, although what we do with them is up to us. How to decide?

Guide for Chapter 16

Abduction

1. *Clandestine* is an adjective that means actions that are covert, illicit, secret, subversive and deceptive. There was a reason why Orvislat and Wilder rendezvoused at 3:00 a.m. in the pitch dark of the moonless night. Evil, sinful, lawless acts are usually conducted best in darkness, not the bright light of high noon. God explains why sinful mankind loves the dark:

John 11:10 GW “However, those who walk at night stumble because they have no light in themselves.”

Proverbs 2:13-14 ERV Such people have left the straight path and now walk in darkness. They enjoy doing evil and are happy with the confusion it brings.

John 3:19-20 GW This is why people are condemned: The light came into the world. Yet, people loved the dark rather than the light because their actions were evil. People who do what is wrong hate the light and don't come to the light. They don't want their actions to be exposed.

2. The argument between Orvislat and Wilder was conducted initially by whispers, but as the animosity between them progressed, their hushed tones became so loud that the driver sitting outside atop the coach could hear them! Their murmurings escalated to the volume of roars. Sometimes, when all is well, our perception of God is but a whisper to us but when we are in a storm, He shouts!

1 Kings 19:11-12 ESV And he said, “Go out and stand on the mount before the Lord.” And behold, the Lord passed by, and a great and strong wind tore the mountains and broke in pieces the rocks before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind. And after the wind an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake. And after the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire. And after the fire the sound of a low whisper.

Job 26:14 AMPC Yet these are but [a small part of His doings] the outskirts of His ways *or* the mere fringes of His force, the faintest whisper of His voice! Who dares contemplate *or* who can understand the thunders of His full, magnificent power?

Matthew 10:27 NLT What I tell you now in the darkness, shout abroad when daybreak comes. What I whisper in your ear, shout from the housetops for all to hear!

Perhaps it refers to the fact that this ancient book can open hearts, influence and change people even in our modern age?

Hebrews 4:12 AMPC For the word of God is living and active *and* full of power [making it operative, energizing, and effective]. It is sharper than any two-edged sword, penetrating as far as the division of the soul and spirit [the completeness of a person], and of both joints and marrow [the deepest parts of our nature], exposing *and* judging the very thoughts and intentions of the heart.

Psalms 119:89 NLT Your eternal word, O Lord, stands firm in heaven.

2 Timothy 3:16 TLB The whole Bible was given to us by inspiration from God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives; it straightens us out and helps us do what is right.

Even believers are not immune to being abducted and held captive by sin, if they let their guard down.

Cursed Captains

1. Upon his arrival on deck, Harrison surveyed his ship and the carnage wrought by Aggar and his forces. Searching for Jonathan, he was horrified at the sight of the shirtless young man covered in blood. The captain's first thought was probably that he had suffered a mortal wound judging by the amount of crimson he saw. Providentially, most of it was someone else's! Why is it that we get all squeamish at the sight of blood? Perhaps deep down, we know the loss of too much of it can end a life.

Genesis 4:8-11 TLB One day Cain suggested to his brother, "Let's go out into the fields." And while they were together there, Cain attacked and killed his brother. But afterwards the Lord asked Cain, "Where is your brother? Where is Abel?" "How should I know?" Cain retorted. "Am I supposed to keep track of him wherever he goes?" But the Lord said, "Your brother's blood calls to me from the ground. What have you done? You are hereby banished from this ground which you have defiled with your brother's blood."

Genesis 9:6 ESV "Whoever sheds the blood of man, by man shall his blood be shed, for God made man in his own image."

In regards to Jesus Christ, the loss of almost all of His led to the gaining of eternal life for those who believe:

Leviticus 17:11 TLB For the life of the flesh is in the blood, and I have given you the blood to sprinkle upon the altar as an atonement for your souls; it is the blood that makes *atonement* because it is the life.

Hebrews 9:22 ESV Indeed, under the law almost everything is purified with blood, and without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness of sins.

Romans 5:9 AMPC Therefore, since we are now justified (acquitted, made righteous, and brought into right relationship with God) by Christ's blood, how much more [certain is it that] we shall be saved by Him from the indignation *and* wrath of God.

Ephesians 1:7 ERV In Christ we are made free by his blood sacrifice. We have forgiveness of sins because of God's rich grace.

2. Upon learning of the dire events that transpired during his absence, Harrison interrupted the midshipman's lack of confidence in himself by saying, "It was **leadership**. It was putting to action what you have learned." Jonathan could never have *planned* ahead how he would react when the Russians took over the ship with the exact maneuver they used but because he was *prepared*, he was able to use his knowledge and skills to execute a plan.

1 Corinthians 16:13 TLB Keep your eyes open for spiritual danger; stand true to the Lord; act like men; be strong;

Matthew 25:13 TLB "So stay awake and be prepared, for you do not know the date or moment of my return."

Luke 21:36 AMPC Keep awake then *and* watch at all times [be discreet, attentive, and ready], praying that you may have the full strength *and* ability *and* be accounted worthy to escape all these things [taken together] that will take place, and to stand in the presence of the Son of Man.

While finally coming clean to Harrison about his secret mission ordered by Spears and Wilder, Jonathan hesitated when the captain pressed for him to state the admirals' opinions of him because they felt he was cursed for being aboard two British ships that were lost. But Harrison was in good company as even Jesus Himself was also considered cursed:

Galatians 3:13 NLT But Christ has rescued us from the curse pronounced by the law. When he was hung on the cross, he took upon himself the curse for our wrongdoing. For it is written in the Scriptures, "Cursed is everyone who is hung on a tree."

1 Peter 2:24 AMP He personally carried our sins in His body on the cross [willingly offering Himself on it, as on an altar of sacrifice], so that we might die to sin [becoming immune from the penalty and power of sin] and live

for righteousness; for by His wounds you [who believe] have been healed.

Guide for Chapter 18

The Viscount of Zadar

1. As the *Paladin* entered the bay of Zadar, Captain Harrison, along with Jonathan and Quinn, stood on the bow observing their new surroundings to assess the most secure location to put down the anchor. After Quinn challenged his superior's plan of mooring at the mouth of the bay instead of docking (and perhaps setting themselves up for another attack) the captain was having none of his argument and told him, *"But our weapon is our speed. I will not lose that advantage."* Sometimes when facing an adversary, rather than engaging them in battle, the best tactic is to flee as fast as you can. This was the strategy that Harrison saw as the best plan for the current situation. There were different circumstances in which he would engage any foe head-on, but this was not the time.

2 Timothy 2:22 AMPC Shun youthful lusts *and* flee from them, and aim at *and* pursue righteousness (all that is virtuous and good, right living, conformity to the will of God in thought, word, and deed); [and aim at and pursue] faith, love, [and] peace (harmony and concord with others) in fellowship with all [Christians], who call upon the Lord out of a pure heart.

Proverbs 4:14-15 ESV Do not enter the path of the wicked, and do not walk in the way of the evil. Avoid it; do not go on it; turn away from it and pass on.

Scripture also counsels us to flee as fast as we can from temptation when that is the only avenue available to us! You might recall the Old Testament account regarding Joseph (of the technicolor dreamcoat fame) and how he was almost...well, let's let God give the account:

Genesis 39:5-12 GW From that time on the Lord blessed the Egyptian's household because of Joseph. Therefore, the Lord's blessing was on everything Potiphar owned in his house and in his fields. So he left all that he owned in Joseph's care. He wasn't concerned about anything except the food he ate. Joseph was well-built and handsome. After a while his master's wife began to desire Joseph, so she said, "Come to bed with me." But Joseph refused and said to her, "My master doesn't concern himself with anything in the house. He trusts me with everything he owns. No one in this house is greater than I. He's kept nothing back from me except you, because you're his wife. How could I do such a wicked thing and sin against God?" Although she kept asking Joseph day after day, he refused to go to bed with her or be with her. One day he went into the house to do his work, and none of the household servants were there. She grabbed him by his clothes and said, "Come to bed with me!" But he ran outside and left his clothes in her hand.

Doesn't seem fair, does it? Lawlessness due to *avarice* (greed) is one of Satan's most treasured traps. God addresses this topic throughout Scripture and it doesn't bode well for the viscount:

Jeremiah 17:11 AMPC Like the partridge that gathers a brood which she did not hatch *and* sits on eggs which she has not laid, so is he who gets riches by unjust means *and* not by right. He will leave them, *or* they will leave him, in the midst of his days, and at his end he will be a fool.

Luke 12:15 ERV Then Jesus said to them, "Be careful and guard against all kinds of greed. People do not get life from the many things they own."

Luke 12:20 ERV But God said to that man, 'Foolish man! Tonight you will die. So what about the things you prepared for yourself? Who will get those things now?'

Psalms 37:7 TLB Rest in the Lord; wait patiently for him to act. Don't be envious of evil men who prosper.

Psalms 37:20 ERV But evil people are the Lord's enemies, and they will be destroyed. Their valleys will dry up and burn. They will be destroyed completely.

4. Jonathan shared his thoughts on being handed temporary command of the *Paladin* with Jenkins, who tells him that it wasn't totally unexpected due to the fact that higher-ranking Quinn had proven untrustworthy and the Captain respected his midshipman's judgement. 1 Samuel 16:7 ESV But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him. For the Lord sees not as man sees: man looks on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart."

What does it mean that God looks at the heart? Read on.

5. As the crew in the villa exchanged discourse with the viscount, two explosions literally and figuratively shook them. Looking through the telescope on the loggia, Harrison watched in horror as a battle ensued between the Turkish ship, the *Echo* and the *Paladin*. Before the Crucifixion:

Mark 14:48-50 TLB Jesus asked them, "Am I some dangerous robber, that you come like this, armed to the teeth to capture me? Why didn't you arrest me in the Temple? I was there teaching every day. Interrogation

1. Following her kidnapping by two men in an alley by the Log and Loaf, Delain found herself in a bit of a bind, restrained by a large sack over her head, her mouth gagged, her eyes blindfolded and her ears plugged. Seems many are spiritually in the same boat:

2 Corinthians 4:4 NLT Satan, who is the god of this world, has blinded the minds of those who don't believe. They are unable to see the glorious light of the Good News. They don't understand this message about the glory of Christ, who is the exact likeness of God.

After spending about an hour in this makeshift sensory deprivation tank, her bonds were finally removed. After being totally terrified of her situation, the familiar, friendly voice of Captain Gorman gave her instant relief and hope. *Relief* is actually one of the best feelings there is, if you think about it. One could imagine that the relief of spending eternity with God Himself in Heaven rather than hell would qualify!

Isaiah 35:5-6 ERV Then the eyes of the blind will be opened so that they can see, and the ears of the deaf will be opened so that they can hear. Crippled people will dance like deer, and those who cannot speak now will use their voices to sing happy songs. This will happen when springs of water begin to flow in the dry desert.

Matthew 11:2-6 ESV Now when John heard in prison about the deeds of the Christ, he sent word by his disciples and said to him, "Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?" And Jesus answered them, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind receive their sight and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised up, and the poor have good news preached to them. And blessed is the one who is not offended by me."

As Gorman, Fairchild, Frey and Delain carefully pieced together the clues that each one possessed, it became evident that the *Echo* and the *Paladin* were most likely lost and their friends were dead or in grave danger. The young spy was beside herself with grief and worry. She was hit with the memory of her last words to Jonathan in parting and lamented not telling him how much he really meant to her. **Regret** is a heavy, horrible feeling that can overshadow your life if you are not careful.

2 Corinthians 7:10 AMPC For godly grief *and* the pain God is permitted to direct, produce a repentance that leads *and* contributes to salvation *and* deliverance from evil, and it never brings regret; but worldly grief (the hopeless sorrow that is characteristic of the pagan world) is deadly [breeding and ending in death].

Philippians 3:13 ERV Brothers and sisters, I know that I still have a long way to go. But there is one thing I do: I forget what is in the past and try as hard as I can to reach the goal before me.

Acts 3:19 AMP So repent [change your inner self—your old way of thinking, regret past sins] and return [to God—seek His purpose for your life], so that your sins may be wiped away [blotted out, completely erased], so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord [restoring you like a cool wind on a hot day];

Flotsam and Jetsam

1. As Harrison and the shore party commandeered the use of the viscount's yacht to investigate the aftermath of the *Paladin's* explosion, Sean found himself “*numb to the entire affair.*” The thought of the almost certain death of his dear friend Jonathan was too much for him to bear. Sadly, we all can probably name a time that this feeling of disconnection happened to us. Not feeling anything is a way to escape whatever pain and worry are in our lives. As David stated in the Psalms:

Psalm 38:8 GW I am numb and completely devastated. I roar because my heart's in turmoil.

Psalm 143:4 AMP Therefore my spirit is overwhelmed *and* weak within me [wrapped in darkness]; my heart grows numb within me.

What a horrible feeling that is! Fortunately for Sean, the crew pieced together the puzzle and determined that Jonathan was indeed alive, lifting the crushing numbness from Sean's heart. But how can we deal with the times when we feel *spiritually* numb in our lives, when we can't seem to find any good news to alleviate our pain?

Ephesians 1:18 AMP And [I pray] that the eyes of your heart [the very center and core of your being] may be enlightened [flooded with light by the Holy Spirit], so that you will know *and* cherish the hope [the divine guarantee, the confident expectation] to which He has called you, the riches of His glorious inheritance in the saints (God's people),

2. After the men recovered the bodies of their lost crewmates, Harrison studied the wreckage in the water and declared, *"This is not right..."* There was a definite difference in the condition of many items in the water and those washed up on shore. Some were in a very sorry state while others seemed intact and almost placed there deliberately. He and Sean discussed the differences in the various marine debris they surveyed. *Flotsam* refers to items that were destroyed in a shipwreck while *jetsam* (think *jettisoned*) are items deliberately tossed overboard to lighten the ship's load. The evidence of both leads them to hope that the *Paladin* and her remaining crew were stolen, not destroyed. All was not lost! These two terms can also apply spiritually.

Flotsam could represent the good blessings in our life:

James 1:17 TLB But whatever is good and perfect comes to us from God, the Creator of all light, and he shines forever without change or shadow.

Psalms 37:3 TLB Trust in the Lord instead. Be kind and good to others; then you will live safely here in the land and prosper, feeding in safety.

Jetsam are the things that are detrimental:

1 Corinthians 7:35 GW I'm saying this for your benefit, not to restrict you. I'm showing you how to live a noble life of devotion to the Lord without being distracted by other things.

Mark 4:19 AMPC Then the cares *and* anxieties of the world *and* distractions of the age, and the pleasure *and* delight *and* false glamour *and* deceitfulness of riches, and the craving *and* passionate desire for other things creep in and choke *and* suffocate the Word, and it becomes fruitless.

1. Both the Russians and the British used the art of deception to aid their side, with Aggar masquerading as an English captain on the seized *Echo* and Jonathan using the body of Southcott dressed as 'Midshipman Moore' to make his foe believe he had been killed in the battle. Just as both combatants didn't directly confront each other as themselves, Satan, our adversary, also disguises himself and others to lead us into sin.

2 Corinthians 11:13-16 AMPC For such men are false apostles [spurious, counterfeits], deceitful workmen, masquerading as apostles (special messengers) of Christ (the Messiah). And it is no wonder, for Satan himself masquerades as an angel of light; So it is not surprising if his servants also masquerade as ministers of righteousness. [But] their end will correspond with their deeds.

1 John 4:1-2 TLB Dearly loved friends, don't always believe everything you hear just because someone says it is a message from God: test it first to see if it really is. For there are many false teachers around, and the way to find out if their message is from the Holy Spirit is to ask: Does it really agree that Jesus Christ, God's Son, actually became man with a human body? 2. The discovery of Quinn, Crump and Crystal's murderous sabotage necessitated the suggestion by Jenkins that the men had to be killed. As commanding officer, the decision and actual executions fell upon Jonathan's shoulders. After the three were dispensed with, the young midshipman was unnerved because, *"These deaths were on his hands, and it shook him deeply."* In the heat of battle, the killing of fellow human beings is often inevitable, hence Jonathan's sense of horror at the act. What does God say about this? Are killing and murder the same thing?

Exodus 21:14 GW But whenever someone becomes so angry that he *plans* to kill his neighbor, you must take him away from my altar and put him to death.

Deuteronomy 19:4-5 GW A person who *unintentionally* kills someone he never hated in the past may run to one of these cities to save his life. Suppose two people go into the woods to cut wood. As one of them swings the ax to cut down a tree, the head flies off the handle, hits, and kills the other person. The one who accidentally killed the other person may run to one of these cities and save his life.

3. As Lieutenant Gray and the beleaguered survivors of the *Echo* sought salvation on the shores of Dugi Otok, they hoped to spot a friendly vessel to take them to British-controlled Malta. Their patience seemed to be rewarded when the *Paladin* was spotted. Some of the crew rushed to the water, trying to signal the ship only to be told by Gray to take cover. Wilson said, "But sir, it could be our savior!" to which the captain replied, "And it also could be an enemy!" They realized that even though it was the *Paladin*, it was now under enemy control. As a Christian, we may run into Christian leaders who seem to be great teachers, but upon closer inspection, they end up being false prophets. How can we know?

Matthew 7:15-20 ESV "Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing but inwardly are ravenous wolves. You will recognize them by their fruits. Are grapes gathered from thornbushes, or figs from thistles? So, every healthy tree bears good fruit, but the diseased tree bears bad fruit. A healthy tree cannot bear bad fruit, nor can a diseased tree bear good fruit. Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. Thus you will recognize them by their fruits."

Snakes and Guttersnipes

1. Right in the midst of the Wilder's extremely satisfying shopping spree in Piccadilly, a worthless guttersnipe broke the spell by accosting the couple and begging for a few tuppence. While Lord Wilder had a smidgeon of compassion in him, the *Lady* Wilder displayed mostly disgust, revulsion, impatience, annoyance...shall I go on? While her behavior was merely manifesting the culture and class system of her time, what would Jesus have said to her?

Luke 18:9-14 AMP He also told this parable to some people who trusted in themselves *and* were confident that they were righteous [posing outwardly as upright and in right standing with God], and who viewed others with contempt: "Two men went up into the temple [enclosure] to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood [ostentatiously] and began praying to himself [in a self-righteous way, saying]: 'God, I thank You that I am not like the rest of men—swindlers, unjust (dishonest), adulterers—or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I pay tithes of all that I get.' But the tax collector, standing at a distance, would not even raise his eyes toward heaven, but was striking his chest [in humility and repentance], saying, 'God, be merciful *and* gracious to me, the [especially wicked] sinner [that I am]!' I tell you, this man went to his home justified [forgiven of the guilt of sin and placed in right standing with God] rather than the other man; for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but he who humbles himself [forsaking self-righteous pride] will be exalted."

Matthew 23:27 AMPC Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, pretenders (hypocrites)! For you are like tombs that have been whitewashed, which look beautiful on the outside but inside are full of dead men's bones and everything impure.

Matthew 5:3 ERV Great blessings belong to those who know they are spiritually in need. God's kingdom belongs to them.

1. In an unorthodox move, Captain Harrison presented two options for his men going forward: return to England or save Jonathan and the crew. His sense of failure in not acting on his earlier suspicions leading up to the present events of the loss of the *Paladin* left him saddled with guilt and remorse. *"He had to admit, he didn't feel like a captain anymore."* In the midst of this anguish, the young leader appreciated what a blessing and honor it was to command such great men and he was determined to move forward and pursue a rescue mission. In the life of a believer, there are certainly times that we could identify with Harrison and his feelings of dereliction, even coming to the point of not feeling like a *Christian* anymore. Can we fail Jesus? Is there any coming back to Him?

My time has not yet come.” His mother told the servers, “Do whatever he tells you.” Six stone water jars were there. They were used for Jewish purification rituals. Each jar held 18 to 27 gallons. Jesus told the servers, “Fill the jars with water.” The servers filled the jars to the brim. Jesus said to them, “Pour some, and take it to the person in charge.” The servers did as they were told. At the Judgment many will tell me, ‘Lord, Lord, we told others about you and used your name to cast out demons and to do many other great miracles.’ But I will reply, ‘You have never been mine. Go away, for your deeds are evil.’”

Revelation 3:1 ERV Write this to the angel of the church in Sardis: “Here is a message from the one who has the seven spirits and the seven stars. ‘I know what you do. People say that you are alive, but really you are dead.’

But You, O God, will bring down the wicked into the pit of destruction; men of blood and treachery shall not live out half their days. But I will trust in, lean on, and confidently rely on You.

Think Above the Box: An interesting point made in the article above is that God Himself was betrayed by mankind (His creation.) *"Instead of fellowshiping with Him, we sinned against Him, and He had to redeem us."* This gave us a model to use when we are betrayed by others. *"When we forgive someone, we are really giving ourselves a gift. Especially when people intentionally inflict pain on us, our withholding of forgiveness hurts us more than it does them. To forgive someone is to give up our right to vengeance."* Stir and discuss!

REAL LIFE: At the end of this chapter, we see the hapless Lord Wilder enthusiastically joining Gorman and his team in plotting how to right the wrongs that had been enabled by treachery and duplicity. He had completely switched sides upon learning the truth. In a similar way, Mitsuo Fuchida, the man who led Japan's attack on Pearl Harbor, switched from thoughts of hatred and revenge to those of Jesus, forgiveness and evangelism:

"Fuchida died on May 30, 1976. His biographers write of him, 'Undoubtedly, Fuchida would have considered his whole life worthwhile if he had recruited just one soul for Christ. And he counted his converts in the hundreds.' He had gone from being a vital part of Japan's attack on the United States to a vital part of God's offensive into the hearts and minds of Japanese. To God Alone Be Glory."

Hebrews 11:4 ESV By faith Abel offered to God a more acceptable sacrifice than Cain, through which he was commended as righteous, God commending him by accepting his gifts. And through his faith, though he died, he still speaks.

4. Sean questioned the name of the Black Sea and Harrison explained that, "Actually, in ancient Turkey, color was used to describe direction. Black was north, so since it is north of many of the Turkish lands of the Ottoman Empire, it was called North—or Black—Sea." The use of colors as symbolism is nothing new, even having been used throughout Scripture:

Daniel 7:9 ERV As I was looking, thrones were put in their places, and the Ancient King sat on his throne. His clothes were as white as snow. His hair was as white as wool. His throne was made from fire, and its wheels were made from flames.

1. Jonathan watched the sun set from the stern deck of the stolen *Paladin*, mentally tallying events in his life, both past and present. He contemplated what the future might bring. Although he felt very blessed and lucky, the most likely scenario for the rest of his life filled him with grief, sadness and despair. *"If it weren't for Jenkins, Garvey and the others, he would simply dive into the water and accept the fate that the sea offered."* Thankfully, the remote possibility of seeing his beloved Delain again dashed that suicidal thought and gave him the hope to fight onward for his life. 2. In the midst of his melancholic mood, Jonathan continued his watch as the captain approached and inquired if any ships had been sighted. An interesting discussion ensued between the two adversaries, with Aggar reflecting that, *“Sailors and soldiers we are, and our lot in life is not dictated by our own desire. Servants of others. All of us serve another, eh?”* He was right. Everyone does serve a master whether they realize it or not. It might be money, success, material wealth, an addiction, a person or group, etc. Any of these can become idols in our lives, putting them ahead of loving and serving God. The big question is this: Is your master God or this world?

Matthew 6:24 AMP No one can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon [money, possessions, fame, status, or whatever is valued more than the Lord].

Galatians 1:10 NLT Obviously, I'm not trying to win the approval of people, but of God. If pleasing people were my goal, I would not be Christ's servant.

James 4:4 TLB You are like an unfaithful wife who loves her husband's enemies. Don't you realize that making friends with God's enemies—the evil pleasures of this world—makes you an enemy of God? I say it again, that if your aim is to enjoy the evil pleasure of the unsaved world, you cannot also be a friend of God.

Matthew 7:13-14 ERV "You can enter true life only through the narrow gate. The gate to hell is very wide, and there is plenty of room on the road that leads there. Many people go that way. But the gate that opens the way to true life is narrow. And the road that leads there is hard to follow. Only a few people find it."

Job 23:11 GW I have followed his footsteps closely. I have stayed on his path and did not turn from it.

Luke 13:24 AMP "Strive to enter through the narrow door [force aside unbelief and the attractions of sin]; for many, I tell you, will try to enter [by their own works] and will not be able."

Proverbs 16:25 TLB Before every man there lies a wide and pleasant road he thinks is right, but it ends in death.

As he struggled in vain with Orvislat's knife at his throat, Lord Wilder accepted that his life was over and after a very rapid life review, concluded that his demise was due to his own choices and blunders. Not to be outdone, Delain also had a near-death experience at the hands of Lady Wilder and a rather large stone. At the

final moments before her certain death, the young woman “realized that all her adventuring, all her life, all her expectations and dreams, now had no future at all.” Both characters were about to die, facing regret and sorrow over a destiny lost. In a similar manner, your last breath is not the best time to realize you should have put some thought into eternity, although some are blessed to see the light of salvation at their final moment, such as the thief on the cross next to Jesus:

Luke 23:39-43 NLT One of the criminals hanging beside him scoffed, “So you’re the Messiah, are you? Prove it by saving yourself—and us, too, while you’re at it!” But the other criminal protested, “Don’t you fear God even when you have been sentenced to die? We deserve to die for our crimes, but this man hasn’t done anything wrong.” Then he said, “Jesus, remember me when you come into your Kingdom.” And Jesus replied, “I assure you, today you will be with me in paradise.”

The author of the following tract, J.C. Ryle (1816-1900), wrote, “I want you to beware of presumption. Do not abuse God’s mercy and compassion. Do not continue in sin, I beseech you, and think you can repent, and believe, and be saved, just when you like, when you please, when you will, and when you choose. I would **always** set before you an open door. I would **always** say, ‘While there is life there is hope.’ But if you would be wise, put nothing off that concerns your soul.”

Think Above the Box: Matthew 25:8-13 AMP But the foolish *virgins* said to the wise, ‘Give us some of your oil, because our lamps are going out.’ But the wise replied, ‘No, otherwise there will not be enough for us and for you, *too*; go instead to the dealers and buy *oil* for yourselves.’ But while they were going away to buy *oil*, the bridegroom came, and those who were ready went in with him to the wedding feast; and the door was shut *and* locked. Later the others also came, and said, ‘Lord, Lord, open [the door] for us.’ But He replied, ‘I assure you *and* most

solemnly say to you, I do not know you [we have no relationship].’ Therefore, be on the alert [be prepared and ready], for you do not know the day nor the hour [when the Son of Man will come].

Many people live life figuring that they will have plenty of time to consider spiritual things and their coming eternal state, but as Lord Wilder and Delain found out, we don’t always get a lot of warning or notice of our impending departure from this world. They were both fortunate to have been saved in the nick of time. Like Lady Wilder and the foolish bridesmaids in Scripture, many are caught by surprise and realize all opportunities are lost. Are *you* ready?

3. After Lady Wilder had pulled Delain off her horse, searching for a stone to kill her with, the sordid details came out about the woman’s involvement in the stealing of English ships. Lady Wilder proudly declared that she was a hero, not a traitor and admitted that she doesn’t serve the British king, but the Russian tsar. We all serve a king of some sort in this life. Scripture tells us that Jesus is the King of Kings, sovereign over all human leaders. Sounds like He’s the guy we should be loyal to!

Micah 5:2 TLB “O Bethlehem Ephrathah, you are but a small Judean village, yet you will be the birthplace of my King who is alive from everlasting ages past!”

John 18:36-37 ESV Jesus answered, “My kingdom is not of this world. If my kingdom were of this world, my servants would have been fighting, that I might not be delivered over to the Jews. But my kingdom is not from the world.” Then Pilate said to him, “So you are a king?” Jesus answered, “You say that I am a king. For this purpose I was born and for this purpose I have come into the world—to bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens to my voice.”

Matthew 28:18 AMP Jesus came up and said to them, “All authority (all power of absolute rule) in heaven and on earth has been given to Me.”

Mutiny and Pity

1. All of Jonathan's preparations for the dual ship mutiny were in place and about to commence when the unexpected arrival of Kharitonov and his ship the *Navarkhia* threw a monkey wrench into his plans. This forced him to make a quick decision on the two options available: cancel the mutiny until a more opportune time or go ahead and execute it. Either choice had the possibility of being successful or ending up with the death of his crew and himself. Everyone will at some time in their life experience dilemmas and unexpected tribulations that can build them up or bring them down. Many people will testify that a severe trial is when they felt closest to God. We aren't naturally drawn to Him when all is rosy, but feel closest to Him when brought deep into the pit of trouble.

Psalm 23:4 ESV Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me.

Captain Aggar and Jonathan's relationship progressed from having a deep discourse on the mutual heartbreaking paths that their lives had taken them down to facing each other in a sword fight to the death. The younger man was able to overcome his much larger foe and at the moment of complete defeat, Aggar asked to be killed, "...my sad life has no hope. I will never see my family again. And I am tired. Tired of it all." Life doesn't get any lower than this. But at what the captain thought was to be his final breath, Jonathan ordered him to escape with his men on the skiff *Alexandria* and to go find his family. What?? Why would Jonathan extend mercy to such a man as this? Why should any of us give anyone mercy in this dog-eat-dog world? Because God says so!

Matthew 5:7 ESV "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy."

Luke 6:36-37 AMP Be merciful (responsive, compassionate, tender) just as your [heavenly] Father is merciful. Do not judge [others self-righteously], and you will not be judged; do not condemn [others when you are guilty and unrepentant], and you will not be condemned [for your hypocrisy]; pardon [others when they truly repent and change], and you will be pardoned [when you truly repent and change].

Due to his *empathy* for the man, the midshipman was able to put all past grievances and attacks by Aggar behind him due to their lives' shared misery. Jesus, by living a life on earth as a man, can empathize with all of our suffering, not from up on high, but right alongside us in the dark valleys.

Justice and Reward

1. A small crew in the *Echo's* dinghy dropped anchor on the island of Kinaliada for a much-needed respite. As Jonathan sat alone with his anxious thoughts by the campfire, *"He felt lost, confused; yet he knew that all was his own doing. Could someone complete noble and honorable actions, yet still be wrong?"* In Jonathan's heart, he knew that the demolition of the beloved *Paladin* (which could have inevitably resulted in his execution) was necessary to save the crew and himself, but it instilled within him a sense of dread for disappointing his friends and his father. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change and though the mountains be shaken into the midst of the seas, though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble at its swelling *and* tumult. *Selah* [pause, and calmly think of that]!

Isaiah 53:5 ERV But he was being punished for what we did. He was crushed because of our guilt. He took the punishment we deserved, and this brought us peace. We were healed because of his pain.

1 Peter 1:3 ERV Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. God has great mercy, and because of his mercy he gave us a new life. This new life brings us a living hope through Jesus Christ's resurrection from death.

She has been permitted to dress in fine linen, dazzling white and clean—for the fine linen signifies the righteous acts of the saints [the ethical conduct, personal integrity, moral courage, and godly character of believers]. Then the angel said to me, "Write, 'Blessed are those who are invited to the marriage supper of the Lamb.'" And he said to me [further], "These are the true *and* exact words of God."

Isaiah 54:5 TLB for your Creator will be your "husband." The Lord Almighty is his name; he is your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel, the God of all the earth.

John 14:3 NLT When everything is ready, I will come and get you, so that you will always be with me where I am.

Ephesians 5:25-27 TLB And you husbands, show the same kind of love to your wives as Christ showed to the Church when he died for her, to make her holy and clean, washed by baptism and God's Word; so that he could give her to himself as a glorious Church without a single spot or wrinkle or any other blemish, being holy and without a single fault.

I told you the most important truths: that Christ died for our sins, as the Scriptures say; that he was buried and was raised to life on the third day, as the Scriptures say; and that he appeared to Peter and then to the twelve apostles. After that Christ appeared to more than 500 other believers at the same time. Most of them are still living today, but some have died. Then he appeared to James and later to all the apostles.

Matthew 12:39-40 NLT But Jesus replied, "Only an evil, adulterous generation would demand a miraculous sign; but the only sign I will give them is the sign of the prophet Jonah. For as Jonah was in the belly of the great fish for three days and three nights, so will the Son of Man be in the heart of the earth for three days and three nights."
